We invite you to Brisbane, Queensland, Australia for the Australasian HIV/AIDS Conference 2009 (21st Annual Conference of the Australasian Society for HIV Medicine) to be held from Wednesday 9 to Friday 11 September 2009.

The conference brings together the range of disciplines involved in HIV and hepatitis management including: basic science, clinical medicine, community programs, education, epidemiology, Indigenous health, international and regional issues, nursing and allied health, policy, primary care, public health and prevention, and social research.

We are pleased to announce that the Australasian HIV/AIDS Conference 2009 will be run back-to-back with the 2009 Australasian Sexual Health Conference with one full day of overlap on Wednesday 9 September. Special rates will apply to attend both conferences.

A new abstract submission system is being trialed this year. This will impact on the structure of the proffered paper sessions. The conference now offers a broad multi-disciplinary program which will be made up of four main themes as listed on page 7 of this brochure and on the website.

# INTERNATIONAL INVITED SPEAKERS

## **Dr. Judith Auerbach PhD**

*Vice President, Science & Public Policy, San Francisco AIDS Foundation, USA*

Dr. Judith Auerbach is Vice President, Science & Public Policy at the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. Previously, she served as Vice President, Public Policy and Program Development, at amfAR, and headed its office in Washington, D.C. Prior to amfAR, Dr. Auerbach served as Director of the Behavioral and Social Science Program and HIV Prevention Science Coordinator in the Office of AIDS Research at the U.S. National Institutes of Health (NIH). She also has served as Assistant Director for Social and Behavioral Sciences in the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, among other positions. Dr. Auerbach received her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of California, Berkeley, and has taught, presented, and published in the areas of HIV/AIDS, social science and public policy, and sex and gender. She has received a number of awards, including the 2008 Career Award from the Sociologists AIDS Network.

## **Dr. Mark Connors**

*Chief, HIV-Specific Immunity Section, National Institutes of Health, USA*

Dr. Connors received his M.D. from Temple University and was trained in pediatrics at Tuft's New England Medical Center. He joined the Laboratory of Infectious Diseases in 1989 to study the immune response to respiratory viruses. He was trained in infectious diseases at the NIH Clinical Center and at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He joined the Laboratory of Immunoregulation (LIR) in 1993 to study the human immune response to HIV. Dr. Connors has spent the past 15 years studying the basis of immunologic control of HIV in some rare patients, termed long-term nonprogressors or elite controllers, and loss of immunologic control in the majority of infected patients. He is now the Chief of the HIV-Specific Immunity Section of the LIR.

His major areas of research are: Cellular immune response to HIV, mechanisms of immunologic control of HIV in rare patients termed long-term nonprogressors or "elite controllers" and mechanisms of broad cross-neutralization of HIV.

## **Professor Steven G. Deeks, MD**

*Professor of Medicine in Residence, University of California, USA*

Steven G. Deeks, MD, is a Professor of Medicine in Residence at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) and a faculty member in the Positive Health Program (AIDS Program) at San Francisco General Hospital. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of California, Berkeley and his medical degree from the UCSF. He served as intern and resident in the Department of Medicine at UCSF, prior to joining the faculty of the Department of Medicine in 1993. He has been engaged in both HIV research and clinical care since that time.

Dr. Deeks is a recognized expert of the immunopathogenesis of HIV, and works from a clinical perspective on identifying how the virus and host interact to cause disease, and how to translate information learned from such studies into the clinic. He currently directs a large research program dedicated to the investigation of the immunopathogenesis of antiretroviral-treated HIV infection. Recently, he has expanded his research interests to include those who rare individuals who are able to control HIV replication in the absence of therapy. He has published over 150 peer-reviewed articles and editorials on these and related topics.



In addition to his clinical and translational investigation, Dr. Deeks maintains a large primary care clinic for HIV infected patients, and is a member of the Department on Health and Human Services Panel on Antiretroviral Guidelines for Adults and Adolescents.

### **Professor Kiat Ruxrungtham**

*Deputy Director of the HIV-NAT AIDS Research Collaboration & Professor of Medicine, Chulalongkorn University, Thailand*

Professor Kiat Ruxrungtham is the Professor of Medicine at Chulalongkorn University, and the Deputy Director of the HIV-NAT (HIV Netherlands, Australia, Thailand) AIDS Research Collaboration. He has published over 120 papers in the international literature and has successfully attracted major research funding from several sources including NIAID NIH. He is a member of several government advisory and scientific committees for the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education and was the Co-Chair of the Basic Sciences track at the XV International AIDS Conference in Bangkok. His major interests are HIV/AIDS treatment and vaccine development.

### **Dr. Endang R. Sedyaningsih**

*Senior researcher, National Institute of Health Research and Development, Indonesia*

Endang Sedyaningsih is a senior researcher at the National Institute of Health Research and Development (NIHRD), Jakarta, Indonesia. She was graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Indonesia, and got her Master's and Doctorate's degree at the Harvard School of Public Health, Boston, USA. Endang's first works were on HIV/AIDS and STIs in Indonesia. She wrote a book about female sex workers in Kramat Tunggak, a regulated brothel complex once existed in Jakarta : Perempuan-perempuan Kramat Tunggak, as well as some related articles in national and international journals. Endang has also been involved in other research activities, especially related to Emerging Infectious Diseases (EID), such as Japanese Encephalitis, and Avian Influenza. To broaden her international experience, in 2001 Endang worked as a temporary technical advisor in the AIDS Division of the Department of Communicable Disease Surveillance & Response at the WHO HQ in Geneva. Nationally, Endang has been involved in several public health efforts, among others, initiating STI surveys and laboratory works at NIHRD, joining a field laboratory in Aceh immediately after the tsunami, leading the influenza-like-illness sentinel surveillance across the country. From 2007 to 2008, she served as the Director of the Center for Biomedical and Pharmaceutical Research and Development, one of the 6 centers within NIHRD. Currently, Endang is involved as technical advisor in several research on major infectious diseases in Indonesia, in collaboration with various international parties.

### **Professor Peter Siba**

*Director, Papua New Guinea Institute of Medical Research, Papua New Guinea*

Professor Siba is the Director of the Papua New Guinea Institute of Medical Research, PNG's leading HIV medical and social research center. He has been with the institute since 1984 and took up the Directorship in 2006 after serving previously as Deputy and Assistant Director. Professor Siba is the Principal Investigator on a number of key HIV research projects including the country's first study of ART, the acceptability of male circumcision, the nationwide mapping of HIV and STIs and more recently the monitoring of the PNG-Australia Sexual Health Improvement Program. Professor Siba is the author of numerous scientific papers across a number of key health areas affecting Papua New Guineans.

## **Theme A: Understanding and identifying HIV: Basic Science, Biology and Pathogenesis**

This theme explores fundamentals of HIV and laboratory based research and practice. Areas of focus include the translation of basic research to clinical and laboratory based practice.

## **Theme B: Managing HIV: Clinical management and the lived experience of HIV**

This theme highlights the clinical management of HIV, through presenting latest research findings relating to the diagnosis and treatment of HIV and the experience of living with HIV.

## **Theme C: Preventing HIV**

This theme explores the range of prevention initiatives from behavioural and social research to biomedical and includes epidemiological and surveillance research aimed at understanding HIV for prevention purposes.

## **Theme D: HIV in populations**

This theme examines issues and experiences specific to populations affected by HIV. Papers submitted for this theme will have a population dimension and will include country specific sessions which might cover a range of research areas, including social research and also health and community advocacy.

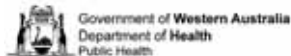
